On August 13, Amit and Sampath led a team of 8 people in a programme to clear wild growth around a well at Samaiya. Due to heavy rains, wild growth had proliferated around the well and access to the well was affected. Our team, which comprised 11 youths from the village, removed the wild growth and cleaned the area. A similar programme was organised at Bhagpur on August 27 to clear the area next to a hand pump.

During August, our team organised 5 awareness programmes on Conservation activity. The aim of the programmes is to promote awareness about the protection of the environment among the villagers, so that they provide support to our conservation programmes.



Chapri –Awareness programme on conservation

Our team encourages organic farming as part of our strategy to reduce the impact of chemical fertilisers on fields adjoining prime wildlife areas. Part of our work includes assistance to villagers in setting up vermi-compost tanks and compost pits. During August, we helped 5 villagers dig compost pits – Buddhan Markam of Sautiya on August 5, Goverdhan Saiyam of Kutwahi on August 6, Kuwer Singh Uddey of Batwar on August 7, Dayal Singh of Chapri on August 11 and Durgeshnandni Uikey of Patpara on August 28.

On August 12 our team organised an anti-plastic programme at Batwar. Amit and Sampath spoke to the students of the village school about the harmful impact of plastic/polythene on the environment and motivated them to remove such litter from the village. The students went around the village, collecting plastic and polythene litter/waste, which were then buried in a pit on the outskirts of the village. A similar programme was organised at Chapri on August 15.
