With the arrival of the monsoon, planting drives are organised by Satpuda Foundation across the landscape. To provide seedlings for planting, Niranjan conducted nursery seedling plantation activities with the help of local youths from seeds collected last month. Seeds of trees such as neem and mahua were planted in suitable polybags and other nursery related operations were conducted.
